
Reflecting on the Work


Brothers,

My Dear Brothers,



Inspectors Message

The Measure of a True Mason

A young Master Mason decides to talk with a long-time brother about Freemasonry. The elder brother is a past master, a Hiram Awardee, a former Officers' Coach, and Lodge Inspector. Despite many body aches and pains, he still drives himself to the lodge to attend stated meetings, degree conferrals, and other lodge functions. As a young lodge officer, his Masonic ritual floor work was faultless. His delivery of memorized lines as a Master during lodge openings, closings, and degree conferrals was spotless.

As an installing officer, his performance was the envy of others. He makes people feel the sanctity of Masonic funeral ceremonies with his impeccable presentation. His delivery of perambulations, obligations, lectures, and charges was flawless. He is one of the best, if not the best, Officer Coaches and Inspectors who ever served in those positions in his lodge.

You have chronic pains in your legs and back, which are aggravated by long periods of sitting and standing. Why do you still attend lodge activities?", asked the young Mason.

"I really love our Masonic fellowship. I find enormous joy in meeting our other brothers, especially the young members like you in the lodge. My pain medications keep the pain away while I am driving to the lodge until I get home. My wife is now in Heaven with our Creator. Our two daughters have their own families now. I am now living alone in a senior housing unit. This lodge, my mother lodge, is my family now."

"As a long-time member, can you say all Masons are better men?"

"As you know, only God is perfect. We are all imperfect. All of us are subject to temptations and make mistakes. So, my answer is, no. I cannot say all Masons are better men. However, I believe a man who decides to be a Mason has all opportunities and means to be a better man. I have met men who joined the fraternity for the wrong reasons, but later changed and became better men."

"When you say, 'for the wrong reasons,' what do you mean?"

"There are men who join because they think Freemasonry can give them many benefits. Others, out of curiosity. They think Freemasonry will help them in their business, social, and political lives. Some even join because they think Freemasonry can help them get out of a traffic ticket."

"Since you have been a Mason for almost all your adult life, what do you think is the measure of a true Mason? Is it the ability to perform rituals correctly and the ability to deliver lectures, obligations, charges, prayers, or perambulations flawlessly?"

"Being able to perform Masonic rituals correctly and deliver memorized speeches flawlessly are good assets to have as a Mason, especially if you are a lodge officer. However, I do not think those abilities are the measure of a true Mason. I believe the measure of a true Mason is if other men followed your footsteps and became Masons because of what they see in you. The way you live your life, the way you treat others, especially those who are lower in rank or social status. If you help those who have no way of paying you back. If your friends, co-workers, business associates, and family members joined the fraternity because of what they see in you, to me, you are a true Mason. However, there is a big problem if not even one of your friends, co-workers, or sons who know you are a Mason, asked you about Freemasonry. I believe you better take a good look at yourself in the mirror and ask yourself whether you are living your life as prescribed in the obligations, lectures, and charges you have memorized and deliver so flawlessly."

Reflecting on the Work


May we all be blessed during the holidays as we look forward with praise to the grandmaster of the universe.

My Brothers,

The schedule for the District Officer's School of instruction is attached, as well as the tentative agenda for each school for the upcoming year, through the next Annual Communication of our Grand Lodge.

This year, due to the attendance issues we have had, the SOI's have been moved to the third Wednesday of the month for Blythe and the Third Thursday of Coachella. Commencing January 1,2024. Quarterly SOI's will begin March on the Fourth Saturday of the month.

Lodge Officers and Offficers Coaches are REQUIRED to attend the District SOIs, per CMC. (cont 16)



That said, however, I recognize that work and family can shorten our cable tow and impact our availability to attend. When that happens, let me know, so that I can maintain accurate records of attendance, which I must do for reporting purposes. (I must remind you that you agreed to serve in your position, as such you committed to the master to attend all meetings and Schools of instruction, it is your responsibility to speak with me if you cannot attend). We can all find reasons not to attend lodge or SOI's, how about finding reasons to attend. The Master of your Lodge counts on a good showing to SOI's and Officers coach nights. SOI's are for reviewing the work that the Officers Coaches teach.

In addition to our District SOIs, officer's coaches are invited and encouraged to attend Division ISI's with the District Inspector and the Assistant Grand Lecturer, the Officers coach is expected to attend in the absences of the inspector. The Division SOI schedule is incorporated into the District SOI Schedule accompanying this letter.

I also maintain a more up to date Google Calendar for the district, with degrees, special meetings, and other events. It is more up to date, and has more information included then the attached SOI calendar.

I highly encourage Lodge Masters and Executive Committees to review this online calendar prior to scheduling events and degrees to avoid double booking events in the district. Do so will encourage attendance at lodge events for all the lodges! Masters should communicate with each other and encourage attendance and assistance to each others lodge.

Reminder that only the Inspector and Officers' Coach may have an open ritual in the lodge, for instruction of work, proctoring during degree. Inspector can authorize use in a case-by-case situation should a brother unfamiliar with a chair be asked to fill in. (Medical issues will be at Master and Inspectors discretion)

Lastly, for Officers qualifications for the 2025 Masonic Year, all officers must be qualified by November 1 st , 2024, for December Installation, and December 1 st , 2024, for a January Installation. Officer's Coaches must check off the ritual work prior to making an appointment for qualification, as well as advise me that their officers are ready to be qualified. The requirements for qualification are as follows and have not changed currently. (Subject to change by Grand Lecturer)

- Opening alter work all 3 degrees
- 1st Degree Prayer
- Staircase Lecture
- 3rd Degree, 2nd section prayer
- Qualified to give the Senior Deacon's work of the Entered Apprentice, Fellowcraft & Master Mason Degrees

Junior Warden

- 1st Degree Opening/Closing
- 1st Degree Obligation
- Master's Lecture
- Qualified to give the Senior Deacon's work of the Entered Apprentice, Fellowcraft & Master Mason Degrees
- Any one of LMCP Courses

Senior Warden

- 2nd Degree Opening/Closing
- 2nd Degree Obligation
- Master's Lecture
- Qualified to give the Senior Deacon's work of the Entered Apprentice, Fellowcraft & Master Mason Degrees
- Any two of the LMCP Courses and Hall Association Management Courses

Master

- 3rd Degree Opening/Closing
- 3rd Degree Obligation
- Master's Lecture
- Prayer at the Grave
- Master's Congratulations
- Floor Work for the above Ritual
- Qualified to give the Senior Deacon's work of the Entered Apprentice, Fellowcraft & Master Mason Degrees
