The cost of this structure has been placed by various students of biblical history at figures that well may be believed to be greater than the total wealth of that part of the world in which the Temple was erected. Palestine was a country of about 11,000 square miles or about the size of Vermont or New Hampshire. Some estimates place the cost of the structure to be in the neighborhood of some 10-20 billion dollars, which included all of the materials, precious metals and stones assembled within a period of relatively few years, and much of that coming from outside of Palestine. Imagine asking the states of Vermont or New Hampshire to commit so many resources into a single structure! Certainly makes one step back in awe of what it took back then to erect the world's most famous edifice - King Solomon's Temple.
