We had a great 3rd degree practice here on Saturday, the 11th of March. Breakfast was prepared by us prior to (everyone survived), and we had 6 Lodge members from the Coachella Lodge drive out and participate. I really enjoyed the number of masons that were there, as well as getting to know a few of our brothers from Coachella a little bit better.
